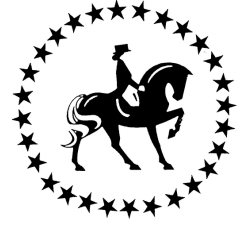

### Markel/Cornerstone Amateur Dressage Championships Qualifying Criteria:

The Championships are open to horse and rider combinations who have earned qualifying scores at two or more Cornerstone Shows between December, 2010 and July 31, 2011. Scores for Training Level through Fourth Level must be a minimum of 60%. Scores for FEI must be a minimum of 58%. Horse & rider combinations must compete in the Championship class at the same level in which they qualified. Horses may be ridden in only one Championship Class, even if qualified in more than one level. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips will not be allowed.

### Cornerstone Open Dressage Championships Qualifying Criteria:

The Championships are open to horse and rider combinations who have earned qualifying scores at two or more Cornerstone Shows between December, 2010 and July 31, 2011. Scores for Training Level through Fourth Level must be a minimum of 62%. Scores for FEI must be a minimum of 60%. Horse & rider combinations must compete in the Championship class at the same level in which they qualified. Horses may be ridden in only one Championship Class, even if qualified in more than one level. Tests must be ridden from memory and whips will not be allowed.
