SPECIAL INFORMATION FOR CDI-3* COMPETITORS

This event is organized in accordance with: FEI Statutes, 21st edition, effective 21st April 2004, - FEI General Regulations, 21st edition, effective 1st January 2005, - FEI Veterinary Regulations, 9th edition 2002, Rules for the World Cup Dressage Events, the Rules for Dressage Events (21st edition effective 1st January 2003), and all subsequent published revisions, the provisions of which will take precedence. All FEI rules and regulations will be strictly enforced.

An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

Foreign Federations: The following foreign federations have been invited to attend: AUS, BER, CAN, COL, DEN, EGY, ESP, FRA, GER, GBR, IRL, ISR, JAM, MEX, NED, NZL, PUR, RSA, SWE, SUI. A maximum of twenty riders per foreign federation and no more than four horses per rider may participate. There are no restrictions on the number of foreign riders declaring for World Cup participation. Competitors are invited by the Organizing Committee (OC) through their NF. One groom per rider. If a class has filled when an entry is received, the competitor will be wait listed and put into a class as openings become available.

1. Rider Eligibility: Competitors must have reached or will reach their 16th birthday in 2006 and must be licensed by their National Federation and may only take part under the jurisdiction of the NF of the country from which they hold their passport. If not a U.S. citizen, they must be nominated by an invited foreign NF. Riders must be prepared to produce their license or USA Equestrian membership card on request of the Organizing Committee, and the name on the entry must be the same as appears on the license.

2. Horse Eligibility: Horses must be a minimum of six years of age (7 years for Grand Prix). Mares may not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or within nine months after foaling date. The nationality of a horse is that of its owner or of the country in which the company owning it is registered. *Horses must have an official FEI Passport. The US Equestrian Federation will provide information on veterinary requirements for foreign horses entering the USA. Horses must be stabled on the grounds and may not leave during the event (commencing with the Veterinary Inspection and ending with the pinning of their final FEI class). Each horse will keep the same number throughout the event. It is compulsory for this number to be worn by the horse, when outside his stall, so that it may be identified by the stewards.

3. Awards: Awards will be distributed to 25% of participants in each competition. Prize money will be mailed within 10 days of last day of event. *Riders are to appear formally attired and mounted for all award ceremonies.*

4. Arenas: Competitions will take place indoors in 20M X 60M sand-mix footing. Warm-up will be across from main arena in 20M X 60M sand-mix arena.

5. Expenses: The Organizing Committee is not responsible for any expenses of competitors, horses, owners, their employees or agents, and does not offer expense allowances or reimbursements.

6. Stable Fee & Access: Only identified riders, trainers, grooms, farriers, treating veterinarians, officials, organizing committee members and two owners per horse will be authorized to enter the stable area. Wristbands will be used for identification. **Stable fees are \$135.00 per stall.**

7. Logos: Competitors may carry only the logo of their personal sponsor on each side of their saddle cloth. It must not exceed 200 sq. cm.

8. Tack check: A steward will check the saddlery of each horse immediately after the horse leaves the competition arena. Any discrepancy will entail immediate elimination. All areas and arenas will be supervised.

9. Objections: All complaints, in order to be valid, must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of the equivalent of 150 Swiss Francs.

10. Organizers Rights: The Organizing Committee retains the right to split, cancel, or change the day of a class or to further restrict the number of horses a rider may ride in any one class, also to cancel the event under special circumstances with the permission of the AHSA and the FEI, and return entry fees.

11. Insurance: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

SPECIAL INFORMATION FOR CDI-3* COMPETITORS (Continued)

12. Starting Order: A draw will be held each day to determine the starting order for the next day's classes. Exact time and location of the draws will be published in the secretary's office. The starting order for the Grand Prix Musical Freestyle will be as follows: Reverse order of placing in the Grand Prix. The Grand Prix Special will be as follows: the riders placed 7th to 12th in the Grand Prix will start first, followed by those placed 1st to 6th. The starting order within each group will be determined by draw. A draw time cannot be changed. Riders must declare by the drawing on the day before the class. Once declared, a rider may not withdraw, except as specified in the FEI rules. FEI rules provide for penalties for scratches without good cause.

13. Intermediaire I Freestyle: Participation is open to a maximum of the 12 best riders who qualified in the Prix St Georges and/or Intermediaire I competition. The starting order will be determined by a draw.

14. Grand Prix Special: Participation in the Grand Prix Special is limited to, and compulsory for, up to the 12 best rider/horse combinations who enter the Grand Prix - Qualifier for the GPS. Riders are obliged to start in the Grand Prix Special if qualified by their placing in the Grand Prix - Qualifier for the GPS. Should a competitor not qualify for the Special, their entry fee will be refunded.

15. In Barn Inspections: Thursday March 30, 2006 beginning at 10:00 am for all competitors entered in FEI competitions. Horses will be examined to verify their identity, age, state of health, correctness of passport and fitness to compete. The Person Responsible for each horse must be present unless a written request has been approved by the FEI Veterinarian. If the rider is under 18, the committee must be given the name of the adult who shall be the Person Responsible. The Jog will then be conducted at 3:00 pm location to be determined

16. Veterinary Examinations: Inspections and Passport Control: These will be carried out in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1011; Rules for Dressage Events Annex I. General Regulations 20th edition, revised 1st January 1999 will apply: In accordance with Art. 139.1 Every horse entered for any competition at CDNs, CDIs* and CDIs** in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CDIs***, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI as a means of identification and to establish ownership. In accordance with Art. 139.2 horses taking part in CDNs, CDIs* and CDIs** in their own country are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

17. Equine Influenza Vaccination: Vet. Regs. Annex VI - All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 12 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling. In many cases booster injections are recommended by the manufacturers at intervals more frequent than 12 months. The FEI Veterinary Committee strongly recommends booster vaccinations every 6 months.

18. Sampling for Prohibited Substances: Vet. Regs. Chap. V & VI and Annex III - Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI's Medication Control Program (Groups I and II only). At all other international events horses are subject to sampling of Prohibited Substances. Such sampling is compulsory in CDIOs, World Cup Qualifiers, Cup Finals, Championships and Games, and is recommended for other categories of CDIs. (Art. 1017.1).

19. Medication Control Program (Groups I & II Only): Competitors at CDIs***, CDIOs, Championships and Games must pay the equivalent of Sfr 12.50 per horse per event to the Organizing Committee towards the costs of the above Program.

20. Approved Laboratory - US Equestrian Federation Drug Testing and Research Laboratory, Ithaca, NY.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
